

Dear Members of Congregation B'nai Israel,

Soon we will all gather together for High Holy Days 5784 - 2023, to celebrate the New Year, atone for our sins, and renew ourselves for the year to come. We look forward to joining with our entire congregation to pray together.

This year, services will be held in the Sanctuary and led by our Hazzan, Jonathan Angress, with an option for viewing a livestream of the service outside. We will also offer service attendance using a livestream broadcast on Facebook and on YouTube.

We are enclosing tickets for your immediate household (two tickets for a family membership, and one ticket for a single membership; dependent children do not require a ticket) to identify you and your family as members for purposes of attending High Holy Days services. While we have relaxed Covid-19 restrictions in line with local guidelines, we encourage congregants to observe appropriate precautions. To attend services in person, please bring your ticket(s) with you and show them to the Ushers. Message from our Spiritual Leader

Dear Friends,

Welcome to Congregation B'nai Israel of Albuquerque. I am thrilled you have chosen us as your spiritual home for this year's High Holy Days. Whether you have been in our community for a long time or you are brand new to our community, you are welcomed and loved. As we prepare to enter the 2023 - 5784 High Holy Day season, we begin to look inward and reflect on not only this past year, but the year to come.

One of the most infamous prayers in the High Holy Day liturgy is *Un'taneh Tokef* - The Sacred Power of the Day. In this prayer, we confront our own mortality by asking God who will stay on earth and who will leave this earth during the coming year. Many past interpretations have used fear to impose the themes of Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur into our minds and hearts. This year, I would like to share with you a different and more positive approach as we enter High Holy Days 2023 - 5784.

At the end of the *Un'taneh Tokef* prayer, we ask God, "Who will be brought down, and who will be raised up?" The idea of bringing ourselves down or raising ourselves up is one that humanity struggles with on a daily basis. Sometimes our outside environment influences our thought process which can bring us down and sometimes we have to remind ourselves to not get in the way of thinking clearly, thereby raising ourselves up. The *Un'taneh Tokef* prayer concludes with the statement, "But returning, prayer, and charity have the power to transform the harshness of our destiny." *T'shuva* - meaning return, refers to returning to the path that our tradition has laid out for us and returning to our authentic selves. *T'filah* - prayer can often provide us with solace and the ability to alleviate our anxieties by making requests of God. *Tzedakah* - giving charity to those in need often helps put us in the right frame of mind in order to raise ourselves up.

And so during our High Holy Days 2023 - 5784, I invite and encourage each and every one of you to join us for the multiple services and events taking place throughout the season. Come and return to your sacred, warm, and diverse B'nai Israel community. Come and pray with us as we beseech God together for a good new year with congregational participation and using beautiful music. And please consider being generously charitable to our synagogue and community so that we in turn can guarantee to be around and provide for you for years to come.

"L'Shana Tovah Tikateivu V'techateimu" - May we enjoy a good sweet year and may we be inscribed in the Book of Life!

Child Care and Family Services

Child Care

CBI has always supported the needs of our young families by providing childcare during the High Holy Days. However, for the past several years we have not maintained sufficient interest to provide babysitting onsite. In its place, we offer means to support childcare at home during this holiday time.

Any family that prefers to have childcare at home for their (2 - 5 year old) children will be reimbursed a total of \$75 for the High Holy Days by CBI Sisterhood. Please provide to CBI Sisterhood a form of receipt or record of the childcare expenses in order to process reimbursement.

We encourage parents to bring their children for services. In addition to the main service in the Sanctuary, CBI will be holding family services outside (see below). There will also be an unsupervised preschool room available for parents that want to take their children somewhere to play.

CBI has designed Family Services to provide a highly interactive experience in a relaxed atmosphere. Services will be held outside under the large canopy near the playground. (If there is inclement weather, we move inside to the social hall.) A live monitor will display the ongoing services in the sanctuary.

During the Torah service, we invite our young people to participate in the reading of the Torah. We will create a temporary bima and use a scroll borrowed from the ark in our chapel. Both services are led by Rabbi Emeritus Arthur Flicker.

Snacks and drinks are provided.

It is a very special mitzvah to own one's own *lulav* and *etrog* set for Sukkot. The *lulav* consists of branches of palm, willow, and myrtle bound together, while the *etrog* is a citrus fruit looking something like an oversized wrinkled lemon with a wonderful scent. Every day during Sukkot, either at home or at services, one shakes the *lulav* as a reminder of the Temple practices and enjoys the scent of the *etrog*.

Congregation B'nai Israel is pleased to offer our members the chance to join our annual group order of *lulav* and *etrog* sets from Israel.

Lulav and *etrog* sets are \$58 each. Each set includes the three types of branches, the holder and rings to assemble the lulav, and an *etrog*. The sets will be available for pick-up before the first day of Sukkot at the Synagogue.
